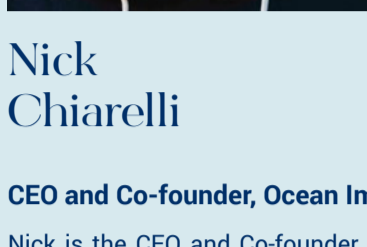


Miranda Taylor

Veronica Papacosta

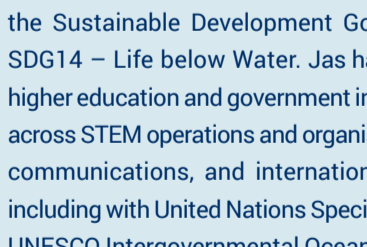
CEO, Seafood Industry Australia

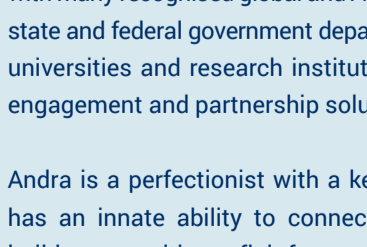
Jas Chambers

Dr Sue Barrell AO FSTE

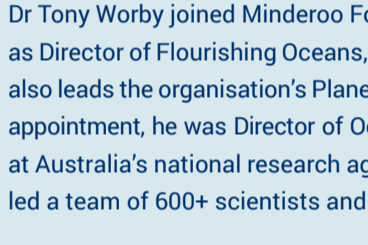
Earth System Scientist

Sue retired in late 2018 from the role of Chief Scientist, and Group Executive, Science and Innovation, at the Bureau of Meteorology, after a long and diverse career with the Bureau, spanning forecasting, research, climate monitoring, science policy, earth observations and executive leadership. She maintains an honorary affiliation with the Bureau.

Through her career, Sue has contributed to and/or led many international science and policy initiatives spanning the work of UNFCCC/SBSTA, IPCC, WMO and GEO. She continues to be actively engaged in the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) on coordination and integration of earth observations and on data, data sharing and data policy. Nationally, Sue chairs and/or contributes to a wide variety of boards and other governance/advisory bodies across the STEM and education sector, with a focus on enabling research through data and infrastructure.

Through these roles, as well as through mentoring and advocacy, Sue passionately supports the advancement of women in STEM, the uptake of more inclusive practices across the STEM sector and the increased application of science-based evidence in decision-making and policy development, especially in managing environmental risk and responding to the very real threat of climate change.

Sue was recognised as a Fellow of the Academy of Technological Sciences and Engineering (ATSE) in 2013 and is a Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors. In 2017-18, Sue was an inaugural STA Superstar of STEM. Sue was included in the 2022 Australia Day Honours as an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO). Sue was recognised for distinguished service to earth science through meteorology and research organisations.



Dr Tony Worby

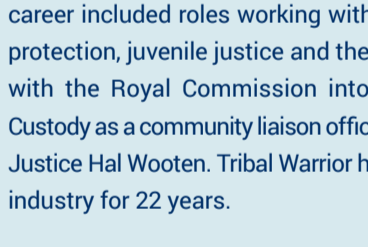
Director, Flourishing Oceans - Minderoo Foundation

Dr Tony Worby joined Minderoo Foundation in July 2020 as Director of Flourishing Oceans, and since March 2022 also leads the organisation's Planet Portfolio. Prior to this appointment, he was Director of Oceans and Atmosphere at Australia's national research agency, CSIRO, where he led a team of 600+ scientists and technical staff.

Dr Worby completed a PhD studying sea ice physics on the role of Antarctic sea ice in the global climate system at the University of Tasmania (1998) and worked for 20+ years as a research scientist with the Australian Antarctic program. He has authored more than 60 peer-reviewed scientific papers, visited Antarctica 17 times and participated in more than a dozen multi-disciplinary marine science programs in the sea ice zone. He was Voyage Leader or Chief Scientist on many of these voyages and has a deep understanding of marine science and maritime operations.

He has served as Chair of Australia's National Marine Science Committee, the Australian Academy of Science's National Committee on Antarctic Research, and the Earth Systems and Climate Change Committee for Australia's National Environmental Science Program. He has served in an advisory capacity to State and Federal governments, and as co-Chair of the World Climate Research Program's Cryosphere and Climate committee.

Dr Worby was a Fulbright Scholar at NASA/Goddard Space Flight Centre in Washington DC in 2000. He is now based in Perth, Western Australia.



Shane Phillips

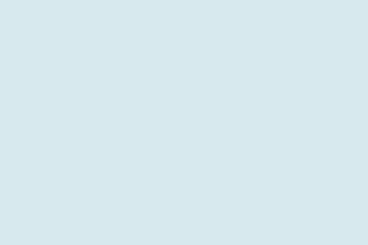
CEO, Tribal Warrior Aboriginal Corporation
